Social Distancing Snood Wearer Guide

This Snood is intended to cover your mouth and nose whilst allowing you to breathe comfortably and does not constitute Personal Protective Equipment ("PPE"). Snoods are not intended to replace other recommended measures to stop the community spread of COVID-19, and adherence to Government guidance, including, but not exclusively, social distancing, washing your hands and refraining from touching your face, must be rigorously maintained. Snoods are not a replacement for Personal Protective Equipment, and in circumstances where Personal Protective Equipment is recommended, you should consult a health care professional.

Wearing a Social Distancing Snood in public may reduce the spread of COVID-19 (Coronavirus), it may help to reduce the spread of respiratory droplets from people infected with COVID-19 (Coronavirus). A face covering is recommended in situations where it is difficult to practice social distancing.

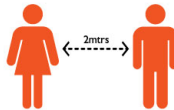
The UK Government has advised that additional Covid-19 measures should be taken by individuals as lockdown restrictions are eased. These include the wearing of a face covering in enclosed spaces where social distancing is not always possible.

If you wear one, you should still do the important things necessary to prevent the spread of the virus.

These include:



Washing your hands properly and often



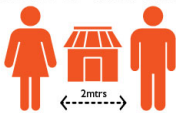
Social distancing (keeping at least 2 metres away from other people)



Not touching your eyes, nose, or mouth if your hands are not clean

When to wear your Snood

You may choose to wear a Snood:



When staying 2 metres apart from people is difficult - for example, in shops, public spaces or public transport



When in an enclosed space with other people



When in an office environment

How to care for your Snood



Wash at 60°C with detergent



Do Not Bleach



Tumble dry on low heat



Iron at Low Heat



Do Not Dry Clean

When to replace your Snood

You should replace your Snood when it:



No longer covers the nose and mouth



Cannot stay on the face



Has holes or tears in the fabric
